The purpose of this meeting is to provide an opportunity for the public to comment on the proposed final Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) report and implementation plan for the Crooked Creek Watershed.

This TMDL report includes data analysis and modeling to determine the pollutant loading capacity and reductions necessary to meet designated uses and water quality standards. In addition, this report outlines the implementation plan, which consists of recommendations for reducing total pollutant loads that are necessary for meeting the approved TMDLs for this watershed.

The IEPA implements the TMDL program in accordance with Section 303(d) of the federal Clean Water Act. A TMDL is the sum of the allowable amounts of a single pollutant (phosphorus, metals, etc.) that a waterbody can receive from all contributing sources and still meet water quality standards or designated uses.

The draft Crooked Creek Watershed TMDL report will be available on-line at [www.epa.state.il.us/public-notices](http://www.epa.state.il.us/public-notices). A hard copy of the draft report will also be available by request from the Illinois EPA or at Centralia City Hall during business hours.
