George W. Fuller Award to IEPA's Roger Selburg

Prestigious award recognizes outstanding professional career

On March 23, in a presentation ceremony at the Illinois EPA's Springfield headquarters, the George Warren Fuller award was presented to Roger D. Selburg, manager of the Agency's Division of Public Water Supplies. Making the presentation was Dennis Leslie, general manager of the North Park Public Water District, Machesney Park, Ill., and the Director for the Illinois Seciton AWWA (ISAWWA). Also representing ISAWWA were Chair Craig Cummings and Chair-Elect Karen Cooper.

Leslie told the assembled Agency senior managers and guests that the award, established in 1937, recognizes outstanding service to the drinking water industry as well as sound engineering skill.

The Fuller award is given by state sections of the American Water Works Association and is the most prestigious that the organization can confer. It may be awarded annually but is conferred only when a committee made up of the section's five most recent recipients recommends recognition of

nominee.

In addition to the plaque presented to Selburg by the Illinois Section AWWA, he will receive a national plaque during the organization's annual conference in Denver, Colo. in June.

Selburg was graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in civil engineering from Bradley University at Peoria, Ill., in June 1968 and went to work the same month as a staff engineer in the Champaign regional office of the Illinois Department of Public Health. When the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency was created July 1, 1970, he was among staff transferred from IDPH to the new Agency. He remained at Champaign until September 1972, serving the final year there as deputy regional manager.

He moved to the Springfield offices in 1972, and on Dec. 1, 1985, was named Division Manager. A registered professional engineer, his professional affiliations include the American Society of Civil Engineers, AWWA, ISAWWA, the Illinois Potable Water

Supply Operators Association, and the Great Lakes-Upper Mississippi River Board of State Public Health and Environmental Managers, serving as chair in 1988-89. From 1992-94 he was a board member and Region 5 states representative to the Association of State Drinking Water Administrators.

George Warren Fuller, for whom

the award is named, was an internationally known engineer for his work in purification of water supplies and treatment of sewage, particularly in advancing acceptance of the use of rapid filtration for municipal water treatment. Throughout his career, he worked aggressively for standardization of water works practices. He died in 1934.



Hamilton County Now Offers Safe Drinking Water Countywide

Southern Illinois county is first in state, one of five in U.S. to achieve goal

Last November, Hamilton County became the first county in Illinois and one of only five in the nation that offers safe, treated drinking water to all of its rural residents. While the last segment of construction is still unfinished, and some Hamilton County residents may have chosen not to tie into the system, in effect anyone living in the county now has access to the same

kinds of water service previously limited to urban population centers.

Major financing for the project came from the USDA's Rural Development funds which provided \$6,755,010 in loans and grants. Additional financial assistance came from the U.S. Economic Development Administration, the Illinois Departments of Commerce and Community Affairs, Natural Resources and the Illinois Rural Bond Bank.

Until the Hamilton County Water District was founded in 1975, rural residents had to depend on wells, cisterns or ponds for their water. The district completed Phase I of the drinking water project in 1985. On Nov. 12, 1999, with federal, state and local officials in attendance, "Water 2000" dedication ceremonies were held in McLeansboro for the new water system, which will serve 1,230 rural cus-

tomers. "Water 2000" is a federal initiative to provide safe drinking water to the more than 2.2 million rural residents in the U.S.

Marvin Teckenbrock, rural development manager for USDA Rural Development, compared the water district's accomplishments to rural electrification projects in the 1940s and '50s. "Obviously it was more difficult to provide water mains than to string electrical wire," he said, "but the goals were much the same. Then, people in the country got access to electric service, and now people outside the population centers will have access to good drinking water."

Teckenbrock estimated the last part of the construction will be completed in less than six months.

Quick's book is aimed at lead operators, superintendents, or facility managers, and offers tips for creative fund raising as well as ideas for managers.

Following registration, coffee and doughnuts, the business session opened with introductions and a CIPWO organizational update.



Most of the morning session was devoted to a discussion of regulation changes and future requirements. Joe Lewison, of the Illinois Dept. of Labor, discussed new confined space rules, and Jeff Hutton, of IEPA, outlined sludge management regulations and the NPDES program status. Other IEPA speakers and their topics included Al Trevedi, stormwater permitting requirements for municipal collection systems; Bob Voss, collection system operator certification program status; and Scott Twait, ammonia limits and NPDES metals analysis.

A chicken and beef buffet lunch was followed by drawing for door prizes that included emergency lighting equipment, tool sets, a Swiss army knife, and a gift certificate to a major hardware store. The afternoon session was

devoted to a discussion of "Efficient Business Management Practices for Public Utilities." Speaker was Mike Humcke, with Environmental Resources Inc. of Pewaukee, Wis.
