The Livestock Management Facilities Act requires an owner or operator of a livestock waste handling facility to report any release of 25 gallons or more of livestock waste within 24 hours after discovery of the release into the environment. This reporting requirement includes releases from livestock waste handling facilities and releases from the transportation of livestock waste.

This Spill Response Plan is implemented to address containment methods, cleanup procedures, disposal methods, emergency contacts, and notification procedures when livestock waste is released into the environment from livestock management facilities, livestock waste handling facilities, egg washing and processing facilities, and land application sites.

Release reporting is not required for releases of less than 25 gallons provided no quantity is released to waters of the state or from a controlled and recovered release during field application. A release does not include the normal application of livestock waste to cropland at established agronomic rates. For purposes of reporting, waters of the state does not include small temporary accumulations of surface water from precipitation or irrigation systems.

Failure to report a release could result in fines of up to \$1,000 for the first violation, \$2,500 for a second violation, and up to \$5,000 for a third or subsequent violations. Any environmental damage resulting from the release (i.e. fish kill) may subject the producer to additional fines and be required to reimburse the state for the value of the damage.



### **In Case of an Emergency Livestock Management Facilities Release:**

**Implement the following first containment steps and where containment material is located:**

- a. Stop all other activities to address the spill.
- b. Use skid loader or tractor with blade to contain or divert spill or leak, if possible.
- c. Call for help & excavator if needed.
- d. Obtain containment materials (straw bales, sawdust, soil material) and implement initial emergency clean up.
- e. Complete the clean up and repair the necessary components.
- f. Dispose of containment materials and waste contents to wastewater land application site.
- g. Assess the extent of the emergency and determine how much help is needed.

### **In Case of an Emergency Livestock Waste Handling Facilities Release:**

**Implement the following first containment steps and where containment material is located:**

- a. Stop all other activities to address the spill.
- b. Use skid loader or tractor with blade to contain or divert spill or leak, if possible.
- c. Call for help & excavator if needed.

### **In Case of an Emergency Egg Washing & Processing Facilities Release:**

**Implement the following first containment steps and where containment material is located:**

- a. Stop all other activities to address the spill.
- b. Use skid loader or tractor with blade to contain or divert spill or leak, if possible.
- c. Call for help & excavator if needed.
- d. Obtain containment materials (straw bales, sawdust, soil material) and implement initial emergency clean up.
- e. Complete the clean up and repair the necessary components.
- f. Dispose of containment materials and waste contents to wastewater land application site.
- g. Assess the extent of the emergency and determine how much help is needed.

### **In Case of an Emergency Land Application Site Waste Release:**

**Implement the following first containment steps and where containment material is located:**

- a. Stop all other activities to deal with the emergency.
- b. Call for help if needed.
- c. Call sheriffs office if spilled on road for traffic control and clean the spill immediately from the road and roadside if needed.
- d. Contain the spill or runoff from entering side ditch, stream or waterway using straw bales, saw dust, or soil material.
- e. If flow is coming from a tile, plug the tile with a tile plug immediately.
- f. Assess the extent of the emergency and determine how much help is needed.

**When providing notification of a release of livestock waste to the environment, the producer shall follow the following procedures:**

1. Upon discovery of the release to waters of the state including to sinkholes, drain inlets, broken subsurface drains and other conduits to groundwater or surface waters immediately contact the Illinois Emergency Management Agency, unless when immediate notification would impede the producer's response to correct the cause of the release, in which case notification to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency must be made as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours after discovery of the release.
2. Upon discovery of a release to the environment that does not result in a release to waters of the state, contact the Illinois Emergency Management Agency within 24 hours after discovery of the release
3. When reporting a release to the environment whether to waters of the state or not the following information is required:
  - a. Cause of the release

- b. Name and telephone number of the person reporting the release
  - c. Specific location of the release including, but not limited to, the county the release is located in, the distance and direction of the release from the nearest town, village or municipality
  - d. An estimate of the quantity in gallons or dry tons that was released, and an estimate of the flow rate if the release is ongoing
  - e. Description of the area which received the release (i.e. field, ditch, stream or other description)
  - f. Time and duration of release
  - g. The names and telephone numbers of persons who may be contacted for further information
  - h. Apparent impacts to health or the environment resulting from the release including, but not limited to, threats to surface water supplies, water supply wells, and recreational areas and water quality
  - i. Actions taken to respond to, contain and mitigate the release
  - j. Corrective action taken to prevent recurrence of a release
  - k. Name of facility and address
4. Within five days of a release occurrence, a Livestock Waste Release Report Information Form (attached) shall be completed and submitted to the following address:
