Re: WIN Production Pipeline

Dear Mr. Headen:

Per our phone discussion, I write this letter to hopefully clarify some changes to our client's proposed plans.

The main purpose of this pipeline project is to be able to apply manure to fields further away from the facility (which is also further from the City's wells) in order to do a better job managing manure and related crop nutrients. Specifically, the pipeline enables WIN Production to be able to reach fields further to the West and South which are more in need of additional phosphorus and potassium. Unfortunately, the field adjacent to the wells is one of the closet fields and has been used in past years simply because of the length of hose required to reach the fields.

Our client plans to continue to use a towed hose system for injection of manure and extend the hose from the pipeline to reach fields that may be a mile or more from the City's wells. Please note the attached map indicating the fields in WIN Production's Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan (CNMP) and that most of them are further way from the City's wells. Irrigation of swine effluent is not planned and would only be used in an emergency.

Additionally, the pipeline design has been extended an additional 470 feet to the West as there is this additional length in our client's EQIP contract. In fact, our client desires to extend the pipeline further West an additional 2130 feet as shown in the attached drawing if the additional cost share funding can be added to the EQIP contract.

This project will benefit both our client and the City of Winchester. With the City's cooperation and concurrence on the plan set forth, we propose to move forward to complete the IDOT utility permit and installation of the pipeline project. Please understand the urgency of moving forward with this project.
